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## **Deadline To Apply For SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans Is May 26**

**ATLANTA** - The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses in Wisconsin, Iowa and Minnesota that Economic Injury Disaster Loans are still available to small businesses economically impacted by the severe storms and flooding August 18 - 31, 2007.

“Businesses that suffered economic losses as a result of the disaster and want to apply for low-interest loans from the SBA are urged to do so before the **May 26** deadline,” said Frank Skaggs, Director of SBA Field Operations Center East.

Small businesses in the following counties are eligible to apply: Adams, Columbia, Crawford, Dane, Dodge, Grant, Green, Green Lake, Iowa, Jefferson, Kenosha, LaCrosse Jackson, Juneau, Lafayette, Marquette, Milwaukee, Monroe, Racine, Richland, Rock, Sauk ,Trempealeau, Vernon, Walworth and Waukesha in the State of Wisconsin; Boone, Jo Daviess, Lake, McHenry, Stephenson and Winnebago in the State of Illinois; Allamakee, Clayton and Dubuque in the State of Iowa; and Houston and Winona in the State of Minnesota.

Loans are available up to \$1.5 million for small businesses that suffered substantial economic injury from the disaster. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. These loans are not intended to replace lost sales or profits.

The interest rate on these loans is 4 percent, with a maximum term of 30 years. The SBA determines the amount of economic injury and the terms of each loan based on the financial circumstances of each borrower. The SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based upon each applicant’s financial condition
